- ▶ LLB is the largest and oldest campus at 189,810 square feet
- LLB has the most programs currently listed at 24 credit programs (43%)
- Has a broad program focus
- Includes the Centre of Environment Studies (including Water & Wastewater Facility)
- Includes the Indigenous Arts Centre of specialization

Overall Program Mix

Our program is our product and must be renewed. In times of budget constraints low enrolment programs can be discontinued.
Since 2010 25 programs longer offered or have changed significantly

- ▶ Since 2007-08 we have added 12 brand new programs
- 2017-18 we have 35 active credit programs offered at multiple campuses
- Literally dozens of ad hoc continuing education and for-profit offerings. Programs move between Continuing Education and Base funding based on budgets and markets

What can happen to a program's home base?

- Practical Nurse (PN):
- 2003-2004 through 2005-2006, Year 1 of the PN program brokered from NorQuest College at Lac La Biche campus
- 2006-2007, Year 1 and Year 2 of the PN program brokered from NorQuest College at Lac La Biche campus
- 2007-2008, Year 1 of our own PN program offered at Lac La Biche campus (including PN with Aboriginal Focus)
- 2008-2009, Year 1 & Year 2 of our own PN program offered at both Cold Lake and Lac La Biche campuses (including Year 2 PN with Aboriginal Focus at LLB)
- > 2009-2010, Year 2 of PN offered in Lac La Biche, and Year 1 and 2 in Cold Lake
- > 2010-2011 through 2012-2013, PN Year 1 & Year 2 offered only in Cold Lake
- 2013-2014 and on, PN Year 1 & Year 2 continued to be offered in Cold Lake, and began offering alternate years in LLB and St. Paul

Culinary Arts to St Paul

- Certificate in LLB until 2013-14 with 18 students on average
- ▶ \$1 million in lab required to maintain or expand in LLB
- Northeast Food Marketer Association established in St Paul
- St Paul Community Futures -industry expert
- Support to re purpose for the two story rather than demolish
- Expansion to Culinary Arts Diploma, Institutional Cook and Baking program. (Food Science Technologist developed)
- Student numbers now average 44
- With \$ from Province, Feds, Town, County and Portage



HEO in Boyle

- Heavy Equipment Operator in Frog Lake First Nation
- Donation of land 10 acres (\$80k value)
- Support of Tawatina Community Futures/WEDC federal government \$650k
- Devon Canada donated \$50k for boom loader
- Alberta Human Services donated \$76k for capital
- ► Wajax Industries donation of \$450k for equipment
- Vision for the Pipeline Training Centre supported by GOA
- Land purchase by College \$192k & one outstanding piece to be purchased

LLB Investment and Growth

- LLB is driving initiatives behind extension studies options
- Hairstyling and Lab: \$950K capital; \$380K ongoing local salaries
- Water Waste Water Operator Centre and current training: \$1.6 million
- Natural Resources Technician Lab expansion: \$400K
- Diesel Engine Technology Certificate launched July 2017
- Fine Arts Diploma in 2019-20 starting on course level
- Indigenous Arts And Culture Centre of Specialization
- Museum of Aboriginal People's Art and Artifacts 40th anniversary in 2018



Water Waste Water Operator

a program and facility in partnership with Lac La Biche County and Government of Canada

- Stakeholder Visioning Session with Stantec happened on June 16
- by April 2018 shovel ready drawings and cost estimates to be able to solicit grants and funding to make the Approx. \$25M center a reality

<u>Current Funding</u> \$501,444 Portage College \$600,000 – LLB County

Used to leverage: \$752,460 Strategic Investment Fund


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Future Level 2 -4 needs funding
