



AVC: Diverse past, bright future


The history of Lac La Biche's Alberta Vocational Centre goes back to 1968 and the federally funded New Start Program.

New Start was a federally funded program designed to research varying methods of educating adults in an economically depressed area.

The New Start program had instructional centres in Lac La Biche, Kilmory, Fort Chipewyan and Janvier.

The next year of operation for New Start saw the Lac La Biche Centre close down because it had overspent its budget.

Fortunately for the town, the local population did not agree with the decision to close down. The native people of the area held a sit-in as a means of demanding that the centre be kept open. In 1970 classes resumed under the auspices of the Alberta Pe-Ta-Pun organization.

AVC expands to 500


Alberta Vocational Centre Lac La Biche has a capacity for 500 students. At the moment, there are 370 students on the campus plus another 200 students taking program courses at other locations.

There are between 55 to 60 instructors to teach the programs. The Centre also functions throughout the school.

Ted Langford, President of AVC, also points out that the centre provides continuing education for approximately 1,000 people per year. They would be taking courses such as the first aid program. Continuing Education Courses are


AVC Lac La Biche, a provincially administered institution, open to all Albertans, was established in 1973 by the Department of Advanced Education. The Centre is the successor to two previous organizations - the federal government sponsored Alberta NewStart (1967-1972), and Alberta Pe-Ta-Pun, a local Native organization (1970-1972). Together these organizations have provided adult education in Northeastern Alberta for 20 years. In its role as a "second chance" institution, AVC Lac La Biche continues to

continue to work with business and communities in developing innovative programs.

Building on a solid tradition of 20 years, AVC continues to the field of adult education in Northeastern Alberta. Its unique enables AVC to respond to the ever changing needs of Alberta. First class accommodations, low paying tuition fees and a warm atmosphere provide students with the opportunity to work in





PORTAGE COLLEGE

Portage College has campus locations in Lac La Biche, Cold Lake and St. Paul with satellite campuses in Frog Lake, Saddle Lake, Boyle, and Goodfish Lake. In addition to delivering Apprenticesable Trades Training, Portage College offers certificate and diploma programs in diverse areas, including Natural Resources, Business, Health and Wellness, Food Sciences, Human Services, Native Arts and Culture, University Transfer, and Power Engineering. The College also offers academic upgrading, pre-employment trades training, continuing education credit and non-credit courses, and cost recovery customized training programs.

Lac La Biche, Alberta

Our Corporate campus in Lac La Biche is always abuzz with activities, whether it be recreational activities, athletic competitions, student association functions or college fundraising events. The Lac La Biche campus recently received grants from the Federal Government's Post-Secondary Institutions Strategic Investment Fund (SIF) that have gone towards three projects:

- Natural Resources Technology lab space and greenhouse
- Water and Wastewater Operator Technician courses with a lab to provide simulated training environment for operators
- IT infrastructure enhancements to support remote learners across the region.

Lac La Biche Campus future Centres of Specialization: Water and Wastewater Resources Training Centre and the Indigenous Arts Centre.





Cold Lake, Alberta

Located in the heart of the Lakeland region, our Cold Lake campus is the second largest campus, and it's conveniently housed in the Cold Lake Energy Center. Recently the Government of Alberta has invested \$1.1 million for a Portage College infrastructure assessment; a portion of the money will be used to plan for the expansion of the Cold Lake campus. This expansion will increase program capacity and study spaces. Programs offered in Cold Lake include Electrician, Practical Nurse, Business, University Transfer, Community Social Work, Academics for Careers and Education.


St. Paul, Alberta

St. Paul has the Food Sciences Centre. The St. Paul campus serves as the hub of food science programming in the north. With over \$5 million dollars spent renovating this state of the art facility, St. Paul offers culinary programming: a two year culinary arts diploma, a baking certificate, an institutional cook certificate and a pre-employment cooking certificate. Other programs offered in St. Paul include University Transfer, Academics for Careers and Education and Practical Nurse Diploma. The campus is also home to our Business Incubator suites that support small business startup with access to four food specialty processing labs.



Boyle, Alberta

Our Boyle campus is located along Highway 831 and offers amazing hands-on training for our Heavy Equipment Operator and Heavy Equipment Technician programs. We offer residence and 'camp life' experiences. Onsite facilities include a classroom, dorm style residences and heavy equipment simulators. 


Satellite Campuses





**"Newstart" Program In Northeast
Aimed At Helping 14,000 Persons**

A quiet revolution will soon be under way in northeastern Alberta. First plans are for programs of academic upgrading, basic life skill techniques and occupational training and preparation for vocational training at the Fort McMurray locations.



In 1968, Alberta NewStart was established in Lac La Biche as part of the federal government's initiative to research basic adult education. NewStart offered instruction in areas as diverse as academic upgrading, trapping, wild fur management, and oilfield management. However, after several months the government decided to close the facility and cease the research. A group of Indigenous students faced with the pending closure of their school decided to challenge the government by staging a twenty-six day sit-in. The group was successful, and the government awarded a grant to continue the NewStart program. The school took on a new name "**Pe-Ta-Pun**" meaning "**New Dawn.**"

In 1973, the federal government once again stopped funding the program. This time, however, the Alberta Government took over the program, reopening it as the province's fifth **Alberta Vocational Centre (AVC)**. From 1973 to 1980 programs and services expanded to include community based programs. In 1980, the Minister of Advanced Education and Manpower announced plans to replace AVC's temporary facilities with a new campus, which was opened in 1985. A Board of Governors was established for the College in 1998 and the following year the Minister of Advanced Education and Career Development approved a change of name to "**Portage College**."

From these heroic Spirit of Community beginnings, the College has voyaged to become the successful institution it is today.
