Am I Eligible for Services?

SLS provides a wide range of supports for students. All students are encouraged to participate in our open workshops and sessions, which offer valuable learning techniques. If a documented disability or significant learning challenge is present, students may be eligible for accommodations. Portage College is committed to creating inclusive learning environments that meet diverse needs.

Admissions Process

Students with disabilities must meet standard admission requirements and follow the typical admission process. If a student anticipates needing accommodations, self-identifying with your Student Advisor is recommended.

If students are unsure whether a learning barrier is present, speak with an SLS staff member for guidance on the referral process.

Temporary Supports

If a student experiences a temporary illness, injury, or impairment that affects learning ability (such as a broken arm), temporary exam accommodations may be required. Consult with a Instructor, Coordinator or SLS staff to discuss potential supports.

Assessment Process

Students with documented disabilities will be asked to provide their documentation during the intake process. Accommodations will be based on the recommendations outlined in the documentation, and all information will be kept confidential in compliance with FOIPP. Documentation will not be shared with third parties without the student's consent.

How to Obtain documentation?

A **psychoeducational assessment**, conducted by a registered psychologist, helps determine the presence of learning disabilities and the impact on learning. It includes recommendations for suitable accommodations. If a student does not have documentation, a Learning Facilitator can help with the referral process.

A *medical assessment* from a doctor may be required to determine if a physical condition impacts learning. The doctor can also recommend accommodations. A Learning Facilitator can provide a form for a doctor to complete if accommodations or supports are needed.

Accommodation Guidelines

The Alberta Human Rights Commission mandates that postsecondary institutions provide reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities. Accommodation does not require lowering academic standards or relieving students of the responsibility to develop essential skills and competencies.

The key document, Duty to Accommodate Students with Disabilities in Post-Secondary Educational Institutions, states:

Accommodation is the process of making alterations to the delivery of services so that those services become accessible to more people, including persons with disabilities. Accommodation has allowed many talented persons with disabilities to make major contributions to life in Canada and around the world.

Accommodation does not:

- 1. Require that post-secondary institutions lower academic or non-academic standards to accommodate students with disabilities.
- 2. Relieve the student of the responsibility to develop the essential skills and competencies expected of all students.

What accommodations can I expect?

Accommodations for students with a disabilities vary based on individual needs. These may include:

- Instruction in Effective Learning Strategies geared to support multiple content areas
- Reading and Writing Enhancement Programs
- Innovative Learning Technology and Equipment
- Classroom Supports and Accommodations
- Exam Accommodations
- Alternate Formatting of Materials
- Reduced Course Load

Roles and Responsibilities

The success of accommodations requires a shared commitment between students, faculty, and staff.

Portage College Staff/Faculty

All staff and faculty are required to maintain confidentiality and support students' academic needs.

STUDENT ADVISORS

Help new students with the admission process and refer students to SLS when necessary.

STUDENT LEARNING SERVICES COORDINATOR

Ensure necessary services are available to support students in becoming independent, lifelong learners.

LEARNING ASSISTANTS/FACILITATORS

Conduct intake interviews, create Individual Education Plans (IEPs), facilitate workshops, promote growth of learning strategies, conduct referrals, and assist with funding.

INSTRUCTORS/COORDINATORS

Assist students with learning difficulties and refer them to SLS for additional support. Work with SLS to ensure appropriate supports are provided.

Portage College Students

Students are responsible for:

- Communicating learning challenges with instructors or SLS staff early.
- Participating in learning opportunities offered by SLS.
- Provide required documentation of the disability and its functional impact to access supports.
- Reviewing and adhering to Portage College's accommodation guidelines.
- Consider the impact of your disability on your learning, and identify accommodation options that would be helpful for your specific needs.
- Following procedures for accessing accommodations and services.
- Keeping scheduled appointments with SLS staff or notifying them of any absences.
